Sam Hood in January

Just when you thought you had it all figured out and knew the Civil War's cast of characters, along comes somebody like our January speaker, Sam Hood, and changes all that. Sam presented a lengthy alternate history to the commonly held opinion of the General. His new view backed up by previously unknown letters and correspondence will make you wonder.

Sherman's Mississippi Campaign

Our speaker this month will be, Dr. Buck T. Foster. Dr. Foster is currently a visiting assistant professor at the University of Central Arkansas. His teaching specialties are in addition to the Civil War include: the Old South, American Military History, Arkansas History, and Historical Methods. His topic for our program will be Sherman's Mississippi Campaign, which was the title of his book released in 2006, which won the Franklin D. Riley Prize for best dissertation on a Mississippi topic.

It was just prior to Sherman's Mississippi Campaign that he and General Grant came to the realization that a new style of warfare was needed to end the War as soon as possible. The Union had until then followed the old method of respecting the property of civilians. Grant and Sherman realized that they needed to break the Southern civilians' support of the Confederate war effort. Once they did that, the Confederacy could be defeated sooner and more lives saved. As the War was being conducted by the Union up to this point, the War would otherwise have gone on for years and many more lives would have been lost. They decided to wage all-out war on the Confederacy, confiscating or destroying public and private property, but civilians were not to be personally harmed unless they were a threat to the Union.

Come hear Dr. Foster' as he discusses how this new way of fighting the War helped to change the direction the War was heading, and how it would end sooner with the Union the victor. It also influenced the way future wars would be fought around the world.

- 3 February 1864: William Tecumseh Sherman, having moved to Vicksburg by boat, begins the Meridian Campaign
- 17 February 1864: The CSS Hunley destroys the USS Housatonic with a torpedo in Charleston Harbor. The Housatonic sinks without a loss of life. The Hunley also sinks, killing nine men.
- **24 February 1864:** Braxton Bragg becomes Jefferson Davis' chief of staff
- **27 February 1864:** Federal prisoners begin arriving at Camp Sumter in Andersonville
- **29 February 1864:** U.S. Congressional legislation revives the rank of Lt. General
