William S. Rosecrans and the Union Victory

## **Bud Robertson in September**

Bud Robertson was at his best when he addressed our group last month. He remains one of the foremost Civil War historians in the country. His address on "What Ever Happened to..?" was extremely well received by the full house on hand for the September meeting.

### **Rosecrans and the Union Victory**

Our speaker for October will be David G. Moore, a history guide for more than 35 years, and a resident Washington DC. His topic will be Ge. William Rosecrans.

Rosecrans was given command of the Army of the Cumberland, he fought against Confederates at Stones River, and later outmaneuvered Bragg in the brilliant Tullahoma Campaign, driving the Confederates from Middle Tennessee. His strategic movements then caused Bragg to abandon the critical city of Chattanooga, but Rosecrans pursuit of Bragg at Chickamauga, where his unfortunately worded order mistakenly opened a gap in the Union line and Rosecrans and a third of his army were swept from the field. Besieged in Chattanooga, Rosecrans was relieved of command by Grant.

David's premise will be, "Why has General Rosecrans been so over looked by history?" He will help us understand how politics and jealousy played a huge part within the generalship of the Union army. The Union army that served under Rosecrans loved him and was confused by how harshly he has been treated by historians. To be fair, Rosecrans was not perfect but much of his successes on the battlefield have been overshadowed by those who have been all too often quoted and sourced by current historians.
