His presentation on the opening stages of the battle left no doubt why he is the reigning expert on all things Chickamauga. His insight and understanding of the battle gave those attending a much deeper insight into and understanding of the battle.

Chris Mackowski

Our speaker for June will be Chris Mackowski. Ph.D., the editor-in-chief and co-founder of Emerging Civil War. He is the series editor of the award-winning Emerging Civil War Series, and the forthcoming "Engaging the Civil War" Series. Chris is a professor of journalism and mass communication at St. Bonaventure University in Allegany, NY, and historian-in-residence at Stevenson Ridge, a historic property on the Spotsylvania battlefield. He has also worked as a historian for the National Park Service at Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Military Park, where he gives tours at several Civil War battlefields. Chris has authored or co-authored a dozen books on the Civil War, and his articles have appeared in all the major Civil War magazines.

Chris' topic will be the Battle of Spotsylvania. This battle in mid-May 1864, with over 31,000 casualties in places like the "Bloody Angle" and the "Mule Shoe", proved to be one of the longer and bloodier stops in Grant's Overland Campaign. Be sure not to miss Chris as he describes the battle as only he can in a style that is uniquely his own.
